Reintroduction of the Cranca Maja squinado in the Balearic waters

- Nearly totally vanished from the Balearic waters in the eighties – minute pop. remains in Formentera
- Definitive causes unknown
- Reintroduction project from the Direcció General de Pesca, Conselleria de Agricultura i Pesca
- First area of releases Cabrera NP waters: protected species in the National Park
- Source population: Scandola Marine Reserve, Corsica








